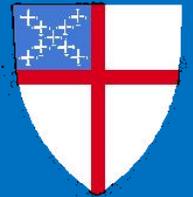



Reflections from the Rectory

I am always somewhat perplexed by Epiphany. What is the deep-down understanding we are supposed to come away with? Some Magi travel to see Jesus, drop off some gifts, and then go home. We don't know if anything really changed in their lives as a result of the trip. How does that relate to us here at St. Luke's? Sounds a lot like "business as usual" to me.

I believe that 2017 is going to be a time of crisis and of hope. While I don't believe that the world is going to end in 2017, I do believe that NOW might be the time to think and talk about what might be next, what might be different ... because, let's face it, things just aren't going as well as we hoped they would be

going ... politically, economically, socially.

In the midst of this, we Christians are people of God's light, but the church has been marginalized, and called irrelevant. Religion and politics don't mix, they say. Bringing religion into things is polarizing, they say. Here's what I observe: churches like St. Luke's are in the center of things. Two driveways in from a main thoroughfare. But not in the center of people's lives. Fewer and fewer people attend. People drive by our churches and barely see them, much less know which one is which or what our connection is to the community. People use our churches for AA, or Girls Scouts, or Jazzercise, or music or dance classes and remark on the good space, or how the church is kept up, or the availability of parking...but rarely do they ask about our initial purpose or our priorities.

If this keeps up, our church communities will all die. And perhaps they deserve to. We exist for one purpose — to shine God's light in the world. If we're not doing that, we are irrelevant — and we may become extinct.

I wonder if we can't figure out what God is up to in Haworth and then get on board with that. The answer to that question is not a secret that God is keeping from us. We're just so busy

with our own agendas that we sort of forget to ask, but we CAN know.

God tells us over and over in Scripture what He is up to: feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, healing the sick, visiting those in prison...always, always loving us — and inviting us to love Him back by loving our neighbor.

In no uncertain terms, God tells us what he wants for us: "I know the

plans I have for you," says the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you a future and a hope." [Jer 29:11] "Let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and glorify your father who is in heaven." [Matt 5:16] "Go into all the world and preach the good news." [Mark 16:15]

As we of St. Luke's seek God, what message will we bring to our

hometown, Haworth? Those who came before us looked to the future and desired to be followed ... and left a strong parish family as a legacy to us. What will our legacy be?

In this New Year, in this important time, may we follow our Lord's star, figure out what He's up to, and get on board! Only by doing this we will find our future, and claim our eternal hope.

An Appeal from Our Bishop, The Rt. Rev. Mark Beckwith



Our Junior Warden, Tamera Lynch, asked us to share the following letter from the Bishop — Ed.

Eleven months ago at our 2016 Convention I named the reality that "business as usual is no longer an option." Since then, you and many others have intentionally joined with me and diocesan staff on a journey to join God in shaping our future - whether through an Action Learning Team, the Diocesan Learning Community, Going Local congregations, Listening Table participants or as a member of diocesan leadership.

I am writing to remind you that everyone in the diocese is invited to the 2017 Convention, January 27-28 at the Parsippany Hilton - whether or not you are an elected Deputy. While the Deputies will still address the typical Convention tasks (budget, elections, resolutions, etc.), there will be three blocks of time — one Friday afternoon and two on Saturday — when Deputies and guests will get together in small groups, listening to scripture through Dwelling in the Word, listening to each other's stories and listening for the invitation of the Holy Spirit. We will focus on the new energy that has built up over the past year and cultivate new modes of dialogue, listening and discerning — a new way of living together.

To attend Convention as a guest, please register online at dioceseofnewark.org/form/registration-convention-guest **no later than Fri., Jan. 6 by 12 Noon.**

Lunch will be provided at no cost to you; you are also welcome to attend the Friday dinner, which costs \$50.

I look upon this Convention as a tipping point in our common life as a diocese. As someone who has taken part in the journey, your presence - and wisdom, is especially important. I hope you are able to join us in this important step.

An Appeal for Vestrypersons

As of the **Annual Meeting on Jan. 29**, St. Luke's will need to elect two new vestrypersons to replace Chris Emerizy and Paul Nobleman, whose two-year terms expired at year's end.

On Christmas Day at the principal Sunday service of Holy Eucharist at 10:30 A.M., Mother Joy made a very impassioned and persuasive appeal to those present to consider stepping up to the plate and taking on further responsibility for parish life as a member of the Vestry.

Joy said that in all of the other parishes she has seen and worked with, the Vestrypersons have gone beyond being an advisory board to the Rector or Priest in Charge. Each Vestryperson would take on the responsibility for a specific area of Parish ministry, be it buildings and grounds, hospitality, stewardship, furthering Christian education or community outreach.

Mother Joy and the Wardens have asked that each St. Luke's parishioner give prayerful consideration to this opportunity to take a leadership role in the parish. Whether you think you are able or not, dare to trust God's guidance and, if you feel the calling, step up and do. There are those who have gone before you who will help and guide you in your efforts.

We are all in this parish ministry together. The future of St. Luke's is in *our* hands. Please give prayerful consideration to how you might serve as the body of Christ in Haworth.






